Welcome

Welcome to Scholastic BookFlix, the online literacy resource that pairs classic video storybooks from Weston Woods with related nonfiction from Children's Press and other trusted Scholastic imprints. This engaging resource for children in grades pre-K through 3 will help early readers develop and practice essential reading skills and introduce them to a world of knowledge and exploration.

Each BookFlix unit includes the following elements:

- Watch the Story: streaming video of a classic children's story. A Read Along option can be activated to display the audio portion of the story, with word-by-word
 highlighting, as it plays.
- Read the Book: related nonfiction text presented in an eBook format. The Read Along option can be activated to hear the text read aloud with word-by-word
 highlighting. In addition, key content vocabulary words are highlighted in yellow. Placing the cursor on the highlighted word will display its definition, and the ear icon
 can be clicked to hear the definition read aloud.
- Puzzlers: interactive educational games related to the specific pair. Word Match reinforces key vocabulary from the nonfiction text by asking players to match a
 definition to the correct vocabulary word. Fact or Fiction underscores the differences between fiction and nonfiction by asking players to identify a series of
 statements as either fact or fiction. Which Came First? fosters the ability to follow a plot by asking players to identify the beginning, middle, and end of a story. Ear
 icons can be clicked to hear the game directions, as well as all statements and definitions, read aloud.
- Meet the Creators: profiles of the author and illustrator of the story on which the video is based. An ear icon can be clicked to hear the profiles read aloud. At the end of each profile is a link to a Web site containing more information on the author or the illustrator.
- Explore the Web: editorially selected, age-appropriate Web links related to the pair topic.
- Lesson Plan: suggested teaching activities created specifically for each fiction/nonfiction pair. All lesson plans are aligned to national language-arts and contentarea standards. The lesson plan is also available as a printable PDF.

A number of pairs are available in Spanish. These versions have the same Read Along option, with word-by-word highlighting, as the English versions. Where a Spanish-language version is available, an "Español" icon appears above the eBook or below the video player.

Getting Around

All the fiction/nonfiction pairs in BookFlix are categorized according to nine themes: Animals and Nature; Earth and Sky; Family and Community; People and Places; Music and Rhyme; ABC's and 1, 2, 3's; Adventure; Imagination; and Celebrations. From the Home page, click on one of the nine themes to browse the pairs in each category. Pairs are listed in alphabetical order by story title. The Browse is presented in an eBook format. Scroll down the screen to see all the pairs.

From the Browse page, click on a pair to go to a Pair page, from which the fiction/nonfiction pair and all its elements can be accessed. To return to the Browse, click on the link at the bottom of the left-hand navigation.

In addition to the Browse option, a featured *BookFlix* pair can be accessed directly from the Home page. The featured pair is chosen based on its relevance to seasons, anniversaries, celebrations, or other timely themes occurring throughout the calendar year.

At the top right of the Home page is a Title Search box. Users may type in any term and click the blue magnifying-glass icon or press Enter. This action will bring up a list of pairs related to that term. The Title Search box is also available at the top of the Browse page for each theme category.

Next to the Title Search box on the Home page is a Spanish content toggle labeled Español. Slide the toggle to the right and click on one of the theme categories on the page. Thumbnails of all the pairs available in Spanish in that category appear. Click on any of these thumbnails to go to the title screen of that pair. The Spanish content toggle is also available at the top of the Browse page for each theme category.

BookFlix contains a variety of resources for teachers. To access them, click on the Apple and Book icon at the top right of the page. A dialogue box appears. Click on Resources and Tools. A page opens displaying a Title Library and tabs for Resources and the Help page. These elements are discussed in more detail under the Resources and Tools section of Other Features, below.

To return to the Home page, click on the Home icon at the top left of the screen.
